### 2014 Angler's Projects

It seems that the members of the Lake Region Anglers are always busy. This year was no exception. The LRAA is not as big a part of every project as we may be of others, but here are a few of the things we worked on and are still working on as we move forward into 2015.

The Four Seasons fish cleaning station has been open for a full year now. We are very fortunate to have a facility like this in the Lake Region. To top it off, it is free to the public. LRAA was one of many driving forces behind this project and continues to be involved with the maintenance of the facility.



We made sevimproveeral ments to the other fish cleaning stations as well. The biggest thina you will notice is that all the water is now overhead. No more

spigots in the way. This also will aid in draining the lines when winter comes. This change was made in an effort to keep things affordable in the future. Repairs to the existing set up were getting costly.

A winter access point was added to the west end of County Road One in Creel Bay. The City of Devils Lake and the Lake Access Committee provided gravel, machinery and man power to create a nice ramp to the ice. The open water was tough on the access point so it was once again improved this fall. In late October, board members Bob Gibson and Jay Hagen met with a representative from North Dakota Game & Fish to discuss handicapped parking at the East Bay boat ramp area. After reviewing the situation and surveying the current parking situation it was decided to install a "cable" type barricade to serve two functions.

#1. Facilitate an area to install handicap parking.

#2. Protect the area immediately in front of the ramps to allow for vehicles the space needed to load and unload.

After the needed supplies were acquired a call was made to LRAA member Shelby Vasichek with Bobcat of Devils Lake. Shelby supplied, delivered, and operated a Bobcat skid steer with auger attachment to drill holes for placement of 4 treated corner posts. Board members assisting were Steve Juntenen, Bob Gibson, Johnnie Candle, and Jay Hagen. The posts were placed, tamped in, and a cable was installed thru the tops at approximately 4 feet off the ground. For safety and visibility a fluorescent yellow cable wrap was installed on the sections of cable that run between the posts. This was all completed in early November. A picture of the completed project is shown below.

Game and Fish plans on installing the handicapped parking

signs in the Spring of 2015 along with an additional sign that pertains to No Parking from the South side of this barricade to the ramp loading/unloading area.



### **Shore Fishing Pier Project**

The LRAA is currently working diligently on an incredible project for the shore bound anglers that visit Devils Lake. In a joint project with the City of Devils Lake, the Devils Lake Park Board, The Lake Access Committee and the Devils Lake Sportsman Club we are in the process of obtaining funding to possibly create several

fishing pier locations and every attempt will be made to have one of these be handicap accessible and ADA compliant. The need is there for folks that are older or disabled and just cannot access the lake without handicapped accessibility. There is also a need for shore fishing locations for the youth of our community and those that do not own or have access to a boat. Many areas are being considered from Channel A, to Henagar Landing, to Lake Wood and the East Ditch area behind the Super Wal-Mart store. Many factors come into play and hopefully funding can be secured to build more than one shore fishing location.
